HISTORY

THE ORIGIN OF PALAIS COBURG

Palais Coburg was built on the remains of Vienna's former city walls. Its history is closely linked to European nobility and the development of the city.

- In 1802, Count Franz Koháry acquired several buildings on what was then the bastion.
- Following a marriage between the Koháry family and the House of Saxe-Coburg, the site became a family residence.
- Between 1840 and 1845, Prince Ferdinand of Saxe-Coburg commissioned the construction of a prestigious city palace on the former Braunbastei.
- The late Neoclassical building is particularly distinguished by its columned central avant-corps.
- The striking free-standing columns earned the palace the nickname "Spargelburg" ("Asparagus Castle") among Viennese locals.
- Today, Palais Coburg combines its historic architecture with its new role as a private guesthouse and event venue.

RELAXATION AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL

The spa at Palais Coburg is located on the third floor. The pool area features an indoor pool measuring approximately 36 sq m, a Finnish sauna, a steam room, a plunge pool, and a winter garden. Guests also have direct access to the sun terrace.

The redesigned fitness area is located on the lower level, with direct access to the Palais Garden. It includes state-of-the-art equipment, a separate yoga room, and treatment rooms offering a selection of beauty and massage treatments.

Silvio Nickol Gourmet Restaurant

Prunkräume

The historic State Rooms are open throughout the day, from breakfast to dinner. The menu features modern interpretations of classic dishes, served in a setting that brings together historic architecture and contemporary hospitality.

Wine Archive

More than 60,000 bottles are stored across six historic wine cellars, making Palais Coburg one of the world's most significant wine archives. Guided cellar tours and tastings with the sommeliers give guests insight into the collection and the opportunity to discover exceptional vintages.
